ADVOCACY

In 2020, Bike Miami Valley provided feedback on more than a dozen transportation projects and park master plans. *Here are some other advocacy actions of note:*



ELECTION GUIDE

The Regional Advocacy Committee published its 2020 Election Guide. The guide captured responses from more than a dozen local candidates from multiple counties. The guide asked questions about a candidate's support of complete streets and new trail funding.

EQUITY

LINK EXPANSION

In 2020, Link announced its expansion into the Huffman and Carillon neighborhoods of Dayton. The expansion is supported by the City of Dayton and fulfills BMV's long term goal of expanding into more underserved communities.

WALK.BIKE.OHIO STEERING COMMITTEE

Bike Miami Valley continued to serve on the steering committee for the first Statewide Bike and Pedestrian Plan called Walk.Bike.Ohio. The plan is expected to be published in early 2021.





RIDE LEADER TRAINING

In the spring, BMV staff offered a virtual **Ride** Leader Training for 8 BMV Chapter members and members of Major Taylor Cycling Club of Dayton. The in-classroom training was conducted virtually and the on-street portion was offered in socially distant small groups.

VIRTUAL WINTER CONTENT SERIES

BMV kicked off the end of the year with a its Holiday Social and first ever, **Virtual Winter Content Series** with a presentation from Mike Groeber of the Ohio to Erie Trail.





ON MARCH 26, 2020, the Link: Dayton Bike Share system closed to evolve to a hub-based version of the system

with its new software provider, Drop Mobility. Link's fleet of 225 green pedal bikes had a retrofit kit installed on them to be able to talk to the new system. In addition, staff worked on prepping 100 electric bicycles, dubbed eLink, to be added as a new transportation option for users. Staff launched pre-downloads of the new Link Dayton app in May, but the opening of the system was delayed until June 23rd due to the ongoing pandemic.

Once launched, staff worked diligently to inform new and existing users about the system and its COVID-19 operating guidelines. Despite these efforts, the pandemic greatly impacted ridership and usage of the Link: Dayton Bike Share system. As many Ohioans were encouraged to say at home, Link saw a dramatic drop in ridership, especially during commute and lunch-time ride activity. Despite these challenges, Link had a lot to celebrate as users loved the new electric bikes and many used Link as a socially distant recreational outlet during the pandemic. At the end of 2020, Link was thrilled to announce its plans to expand to two Dayton neighborhoods in 2021.

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CHAPTERS

The Chapter Program of Bike Miami Valley allows local communities to advocate, promote and create cycling program opportunities in their communities under the umbrella of Bike Miami Valley. The first chapter was launched in 2013, and this year, BMV was pleased to welcome its fifth chapter, Cycle Kettering, to the family.

HERE'S WHAT ALL OF THE CHAPTERS ACCOMPLISHED IN 2020:



Bike Springfield partnered with Springfield CVB, Mother Stewarts, Co-Hatch, and Cyclotherapy to install a temporary vinyl mural at bike path crossing at Leffel Ln, which will help encourage riders to continue north into Springfield. The Chapter also received a grant from the Ohio Bicycle Federation for a permanent mural to be painted at Leffel Lane in mid 2021. Bike Springfield also worked with National Trails Parks and Recreation District (NTPRD) on their virtual Family Bike Ride. While ride participation numbers are unknown, the bike safety video created by Bike Springfield and shared by NTPRD reached 1,000 people.



Bike Centerville organized several small group rides this past summer with assistance from Centerville-Washington Parks and plans to continue the tradition in 2021. Bike Centerville focused on designing and recommending to the municipalities two north-south signed routes, each starting near the southern edge of Washington Township. One proposed route intersects Bigger Rd and eventually merges with the Iron Horse Trail while the second proposed route follows Paragon Road and terminates at Whipp Road near John Hole School. The Centerville chapter will continue to advocate for more signage and safety measures on the current Route 12 and the two proposed routes.



Bike Yellow Springs Business Member, Yellow Springer Tees and Promotions, helped launch an online merchandise store for Bike Miami Valley and all of its Chapters. The store can be found on the Bike Miami Valley website.



In light of the pandemic, Bike Piqua suspended most of its programming for 2020 and shifted focus to 2021 to bring back its neighborhood slow rolls and education programs for the local schools.



Cycle Kettering spent 2020 coordinating the launch of its Chapter with a survey of Kettering residents to help focus its future advocacy efforts. Chapter members also spent time helping to plan the 2021 Miami Valley Cycling Summit, which will be held in Kettering.
